Holy Week and Easter Newsletter 2021

Dear Friends,

The Christmas services didn't turn out as we planned, when we went back into lockdown before our Christmas Eve service. We ended up back on Zoom and have been there ever since.

Now as we begin to emerge from lockdown our first service in church will be on Easter Sunday!

We didn't get to celebrate Easter in church in 2020 but, God willing, we will this year on Sunday 4th April.

Our last Sunday Service on Zoom will be Palm Sunday 28th March. (Please bring an old Palm Cross if you have one.)

During Holy Week we will have an opportunity to follow Our Lord to the Cross with services on Zoom. On Wednesday 31st March: Night Prayer at 8pm, on Maundy Thursday 1st April: A Chrism Mass from the Cathedral at 10.30am and on Friday 2nd April: Stations on the Cross at 12noon all via Zoom.

It's a big step to come back to church after a period of lockdown. We will still have to wear masks and be socially distanced, but I hope many of you will feel able to return to our beautiful church on Easter Sunday.

Booking will be essential to ensure that you get a seat. Priority will be given to those of the congregation who have not been able to join us on Zoom. (There should be room for all of us as some people are not yet able to return.)

The daffodils are blooming in the church garden, the church has been professionally cleaned and all the safeguarding arrangements are in place.

Easter Sunday is always a special day when we rejoice in the death and resurrection of Our Lord, rejoice in the gift of our salvation. Lent has been long this year; we have been fasting since just before Christmas. There's been no communion bread for us in lockdown.

On Easter Sunday Our Lord will welcome us back to His table. Alleluia!

For those who will not be able to join us on that day, may I wish you joy in the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ..
