#### News from eSwatini

The Diocese of Swaziland Elective Assembly met last week to elect a new bishop. After many rounds of voting the candidates remained deadlocked with neither getting the 2/3 majority needed for election. The process in the Anglican Church of Southern Africa now calls on the provincial bishops to meet and decide on the appointment of the next bishop.

This will be a time of considerable anxiety in the diocese so we will share election results as soon as we receive any news.

Please keep our friends in eSwatini in your prayers. The civil unrest continues and Covid19 and food shortages are seriously affecting the population.

### The lifting of Covid restrictions on 9 August.

Some changes in church-

The two Chairs and prayer desks (Priest's and Lay Reader's) will come back to their normal positions (they've been in the Chancel during lockdown).

The blue ribbon blocking off certain rows and seats will be removed as will the markers on seats showing those that can be occupied.

The seats which used to be in the Chancel (currently stored in the Hall) will gradually reappear.

The need for face coverings in the building remains and the procedures for using hand sanitisers on entry, leaving the building plus pre and post communion are unchanged. While the 1 metre distancing rule has also gone, the Vestry encourages everyone to remain careful and to be respectful of everyone else's space. Based on recent Sunday attendances, there is ample seating for all with sufficient distancing. (No need for seat booking.) The Usher on duty will continue to direct the flow of people for Communion.

While post service refreshments are now allowable (with conditions), we are not going to restart these right away but will monitor the situation over the next while. There is no compulsion to do everything straight away. Step by step will be our guideline.
